RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the resolution authorizing the submittal of a Regional Application to the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) for a multi-year Used Oil Recycling Block Grant, a reimbursable amount up to \$30,000 for year one.

INTRODUCTION

The Westside Cities, comprised of Beverly Hills, West Hollywood and Culver City, participate in a regional Used Oil Recycling Block Grant program funded by CIWMB. The City of Beverly Hills will serve as the lead agency for this grant effective July 1, 2008. As part of this responsibility, Beverly Hills needs to apply for the Grant for the fiscal years 2008-2011.

DISCUSSION

For the last twelve years, the Cities of Beverly Hills, West Hollywood and Culver City participated in a regional Used Oil Recycling Block Grant program. The funds were used to promote oil recycling. The funds were used in part to hire a consultant who is responsible for promoting the program through public outreach and education, giveaway programs and attending City sponsored events. The scope of services include hanging street light pole banners for the City of West Hollywood on Sunset Boulevard, and in all cities, coordinate with local oil change outlets a program to promote the use of re-refined oil and oil filter recycling. 

Beverly Hills are the Household Hazardous Waste Roundups, the Earth Day Celebration at the Farmers' Market and other outreach opportunities as appropriate.

The City of Beverly Hills last served as lead agency for the grant in fiscal year 2002/2003. The City of Beverly Hills will again administer the program for the next three-year term.

FISCAL IMPACT

The Used Oil Recycling Block Grant program funded by the CIWMB reimburses the City for funds used for this program. The estimated amount of this grant is \$30,000.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
BEVERLY HILLS AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF A
REGIONAL APPLICATION ON BEHALF OF THE CITIES OF
BEVERLY HILLS, WEST HOLLYWOOD AND CULVER CITY
FOR A MULTI-YEAR USED OIL RECYCLING BLOCK
GRANT

The City Council of the City of Beverly Hills does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. The people of the State of California have enacted the California Oil Recycling Enhancement Act that provides funds to cities and counties for establishing and maintaining local used oil collection programs that encourage recycling or appropriate disposal of used oil.

Section 2. The California Integrated Waste Management Board ("CIWMB") has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of the program within the state, setting up necessary procedures governing application by cities and counties under the program.

Section 3. It is hereby resolved that the City Council of the City of Beverly Hills authorizes the submittal of a regional application on behalf of the cities of Beverly Hills, West Hollywood and Culver City to the CIWMB for a 2008/2011 Used Oil Recycling Block Grant. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute in the name of the City of Beverly Hills all necessary applications, contracts, payment requests, agreements, and amendments hereto for the purposes of securing grant funds and to implement and carry out the purposes specified in the grant application.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution and shall cause this Resolution and his certification to be entered in the Book of Resolutions of the Council of this City.


