INTRODUCTION

Councilmember Mirisch has requested the City Council discuss the issuance of Class 1 permits, including the addition of the Deputy City Treasurer title to the list of eligible permit recipients.

DISCUSSION

Section 7-3-111 of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code (BHMC) establishes the authority and privileges related to the issuance and use of the City's Class 1 permits.

Staff estimates it will take approximately 90 days to implement changes in the BHMC, including scheduling the reading and adoption at a future Formal City Council meeting, a second reading, and 30 days for the new ordinance to take effect.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no measurable fiscal impact at this time.

RECOMMENDATION

There is no staff recommendation at this time.

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7-3-111: CLASS I PARKING PERMITS:

- A. A vehicle which bears a Class I parking permit and is being used for city business may park:
1. In a parking meter space without the deposit of any coin in the adjacent parking meter.
 2. In a parking meter space or in a nonmetered parking space for a period of time in excess of the posted maximum parking time permitted, but not during posted peak hour parking restriction periods.
 3. In any preferential parking zone.
 4. In any parking lot or structure owned by the city without payment of the required fees and in excess of the maximum permitted time for parking.
- B. Class 1 permits shall be issued by the transportation and engineering officer only as follows:
1. One permit for each vehicle legally registered to each current and former member of the city council, each current and former city treasurer, and each current member of the planning, architectural, traffic and parking, human relations, public works, recreation and parks, fine art, and charitable solicitations commissions.
 2. One permit to the city manager, city attorney, city clerk, and each executive management employee designated in the city's compensation plan.
 3. Notwithstanding any other provision in this section, no more than two (2) permits shall be issued per household. For the purposes of this section, "household" shall be defined as all persons who dwell within the same dwelling unit.
- C. Class I permits shall be displayed in the lower left corner of the front windshield of the vehicle. (1962 Code § 3-4.107; amd.
