INTRODUCTION

Attached is information from The Beverly Hills Conference & Visitor Bureau (BHCVB) regarding a food and beverage event entitled *Beverly Hills Under the Stars* proposed for the 200 and 300 blocks of North Rodeo Drive on Thursday, September 27 from 6 p.m. to 10:30 p.m.

DISCUSSION

This premiere food and beverage event has been held in Paris and other international locations for 25 years and was recently launched in New York and San Francisco. For the first time, they would like to include the Southern California region and have chosen Beverly Hills as their desired venue. Approximately 700-1,000 guests are anticipated to purchase tickets in advance and agree to meet at a pre-determined location prior to being shuttled to the final destination. Guests are instructed to dress in white and must bring their own food and beverages in order to participate in the "chic picnic in a public setting" program.

It is anticipated the event will be filmed and possibly air on the television series "Top Chef." A documentary about the history of the event is currently being filmed and is anticipated to be shown at the Sundance Film Festival; footage of the Beverly Hills event may be included.

STREET CLOSURE

The following information provides details of the proposed street closures for this event:

- The 200 and 300 blocks of North Rodeo Drive and Dayton Way, between the alleys east and west of Rodeo Drive would be closed from 4 p.m. to midnight on Thursday, September 27 for event set-up, event and breakdown activity.

MERCHANT NOTIFICATION

As with previous large-scale events on North Rodeo Drive, all affected merchants on the 200, 300 and 400 blocks of North Rodeo Drive, Dayton and Brighton Ways, between Camden and Beverly Drives, will receive advanced notice of the upcoming activity.

The Rodeo Drive Committee has provided a letter of support (see Attachment 2) indicating their endorsement of the event and Rodeo Drive street closure.

FISCAL IMPACT

As a sponsor of the event, the BHCVB will be responsible for all City personnel costs and permit fees. As the City is a sponsor of the BHCVB, the street closure fee will not be charged. In addition, BHCVB will be responsible for a Certificate of Insurance of \$2 million in General Liability, naming the City of Beverly Hills as an additional insured.

RECOMMENDATION

Community Services has reviewed the preliminary event details with Police and Fire personnel and has determined the event is feasible with the proper staffing. Staff and the BHCVB also hope to be reviewing this request with the City Council Liaison Committee prior to the August 23 study session. With the prestige and international publicity generated by this event, staff supports approval of the request to close North Rodeo Drive as outlined above.

Beverly Hills Conference & Visitors Bureau representatives will be available at the August 23 study session in order to provide updated details of the event. City Council direction is respectfully requested regarding the BHCVB's request to close the 200 and 300 blocks of North Rodeo Drive for the *Beverly Hills Under the Stars* event on Thursday, September 27, 2012.



Founded by François Pasquier in 1988, the concept came out spontaneously when after a few years abroad he wanted to hold a dinner party to reconnect with friends.

So many wanted to come that he asked them to convene at the Bois de Boulogne and to dress in white, so they could find each other. Each friend was required to bring a friend.

24 years later, the French capital's most prestigious sites have played host to it: the Pont des Arts, the Eiffel Tower garden, the Louvre Pyramid, the Trocadero Esplanade, Place Vendôme, the Château de Versailles, the Esplanade

de Notre-Dame, the Esplanade des Invalides, the periphery of the Place de l'Étoile, the Champs-Élysées, Place de la Concorde and last year: The Carousel du Louvre.



Following in the footsteps of Paris, one of the sons of François Pasquier, Aymeric Pasquier and associated himself with Sandy Safi to launch the first US event in New York. On August 25th, 2011, 1200 diners (selected from over 30,000 hopefuls) celebrated outdoors in front of the wonderful World Financial Center in Battery Park. Guests dressed in elegant white, brought their own epicurean feasts, tables, chairs, glasses, silver and white napery.
