The Adjourned Regular City Council meeting was held in the Council Chambers at 7:00 pm.

TO CONSIDER:

This being the time and place set, a public hearing was held to consider:

1. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS ESTABLISHING DEFINITIONS, DESIGNATING USE, AND ADOPTING LOCAL PLANNING AND APPROVAL REQUIREMENTS FOR EMERGENCY SHELTERS, TRANSITIONAL AND SUPPORTIVE HOUSING, COMMUNITY CARE FACILITIES, AND SINGLE ROOM OCCUPANCY UNITS AND AMENDING THE BEVERLY HILLS MUNICIPAL CODE. First Reading - For Introduction. Comment: This ordinance complies with State requirements under Senate Bill 2 and implements Housing Element Program 12.1 "Zoning Text Amendments for Special Needs Housing".

The notice of the hearing was published as required by law and an affidavit to this effect is on file with the City Clerk.

The records and files of the Community Development Department and the report of the Senior Planner concerning this matter shall be entered into the record.

Senior Planner Peter Noonan presented the PowerPoint staff report. He provided a background on the item, the forms of special needs housing, a map of the multi-family congregate housing for elderly and disabled persons, and recommended that the City Council affirm the Planning Commission decision on this matter.

Councilmember Gold inquired about the State requirements and consequences of not following the requirements. Councilmember Bosse acknowledged the work of the Planning Commission on the certification of the housing element. She asked why the Single Room Occupancy (SRO) zone requires a CUP, and the impacts of an SRO. Vice Mayor Mirisch expressed his disappointment on the requirements and limitations on the housing element imposed by the State.

MOVED by Councilmember Bosse, seconded by Councilmember Brucker to introduce and read by Title only and advance to the meeting of October 2, 2012 for adoption Ordinance D-1 as follows:

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS ESTABLISHING PREFERENTIAL PARKING ZONE "O" ON THE 600 BLOCK OF NORTH ALTA DRIVE AND THE ADJACENT SECTIONS OF CARMELITA AND ELEVADO AVENUES BETWEEN THE EAST AND WEST ALLEYWAYS. Comment: Qualifying petition to establish "No Parking, 8 pm to 2:30 am, Daily, Permit "O" Exempt" regulation to address parking intrusion.

Councilmember Gold expressed his support on the item based on the majority of residents who spoke of their support and the Traffic and Parking Commission (TPC) recommendation. He asked the TPC to put on its work list identifying the permit parking needs of the City and possibly consolidating the permit zones to make the permitting process more efficient. Mayor Brien acknowledged the presence of TPC Chair Julie Steinberg to answer any questions addressed to the TPC.

Councilmember Bosse asked whether the permit cost is street-specific or applicable to all permit zones. She explained, for the benefit of Mr. Hooman Dayani, that there is a public process currently in place that the City is following.

Councilmember Brucker thanked TPC Chair Steinberg and the entire Commission for their work. He inquired how long the petition process takes from the time it is taken to the Commission for review through Council approval. He suggested that the neighboring residents be informed of what will happen in the next few months so that they can be prepared, and file a petition to expedite the process if they wish to do so.

Vice Mayor Mirisch expressed his concern on the domino effect the permit parking is causing. He asked staff if the City of West Hollywood has an ordinance requiring businesses to provide employee parking, and suggested that an outreach effort to the City of West Hollywood be done.

Mayor Brien expressed his support on this quality of life issue.

MOVED by Councilmember Gold, seconded by Councilmember Bosse to adopt Resolution E-1 as follows:

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS:

3. AMENDING THE BEVERLY HILLS MUNICIPAL CODE TO INCREASE THE VOLUNTARY EXPENDITURE CEILING FOR ELECTIONS. Second Reading - For Adoption. Comment: This ordinance increases the voluntary expenditure ceiling for elections from \$75,000 to \$80,000. The individual contribution limit will remain at \$400 if a candidate accepts the spending limit of \$80,000, and \$125 if the candidate does not accept the spending limit.

4. ACCEPTING A FIREMAN'S FUND HERITAGE PROGRAM GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$13,742, APPROVING AN AGREEMENT WITH FIREMAN'S FUND, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF FIRE PREVENTION EDUCATION AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH SUPPLIES. Comment: The City of Beverly Hills has been approved to receive a grant in the amount of \$13,742.00. The funding will be used for the purchases of various Fire Prevention education and community outreach materials, such as the Commercial Fire Safety Education, preseason brush clearance & midyear brush fire readiness & evacuation education mailers and for the Fire Prevention Week's and school educational materials.

5. THE CITY'S PLAN ADMINISTRATOR TO SIGN THE AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT WITH ICMA-RC FOR INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT SERVICES AND PLAN ADMINISTRATION Comment: Staff recommends the City Council authorize the City's ICMA Retirement Corporation Plan Administrator (Chief Financial Officer) to amend the agreement terms. The amendment to the agreement will generate \$80,000 annually for the City of Beverly Hills.

ITEM F-5: APPROVED

6. A FUNDING AGREEMENT WITH THE BEVERLY HILLS CHAMBER OF COMMERCE AND CIVIC ASSOCIATION FOR BUSINESS ATTRACTION AND RETENTION SERVICES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013; AND APPROVAL OF A PURCHASE ORDER IN A NOT-TO-EXCEED AMOUNT OF \$240,000 TO THE BEVERLY HILLS CHAMBER OF COMMERCE AND CIVIC ASSOCIATION FOR THESE SERVICES. Comment: This is a funding agreement between the City of Beverly Hills and the Beverly Hills Chamber of Commerce and Civic Association for business attraction and retention services for FY 2012-13. The City Council is also asked to approve a purchase order in a not-to-exceed amount of \$240,000 for these services.

ITEM F-6: APPROVED AG# 421-12

7. AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE AGREEMENT WITH REDFLEX TRAFFIC SYSTEMS, INC. FOR PHOTO RED LIGHT ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM. Comment: This amendment continues the City's agreement with Redflex Traffic Systems, Inc., which provides support for the City's red light enforcement program.

ITEM F-7: APPROVED AG# 422-12

8. AGREEMENT WITH DAVID TURCH AND ASSOCIATES, FOR FEDERAL REGULATORY REPRESENTATION AND LEGISLATIVE SERVICES; AND AUTHORIZATION OF A PURCHASE ORDER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$55,000 TO DAVID TURCH AND ASSOCIATES FOR THESE SERVICES. Comment: An Agreement with David Turch and Associates for legislative advocacy services in Washington, D.C. to promote the City's legislative agenda and key initiatives, in the amount of \$55,000.

ITEM F-8: APPROVED AG# 423-12

9. AN AGREEMENT WITH RODEO DRIVE, INC. FOR RODEO DRIVE HOLIDAY DÉCOR; AND APPROVAL OF A PURCHASE ORDER IN A NOT-TO-EXCEED AMOUNT OF \$163,105 FOR THESE SERVICES. Comment: Requests approval of an agreement to provide funding for Rodeo Drive holiday décor for the 2012 holiday season. The City Council is also asked to approve a purchase order in a not-to-exceed amount of \$163,105 for these services.

10. A PURCHASE ORDER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$300,000 TO EQUARIUS WATERWORKS FOR THE PURCHASE OF NEPTUNE WATER METERS AND PARTS. Comment: Equarius Waterworks is currently the only authorized distributor in the State of California for Neptune RF meter reading equipment, Neptune water meters and parts. The City of Beverly Hills standardized on Neptune water meters in 2007. Staff recommends to continue to use Neptune water meters and to approve a purchase order in the amount of \$300,000 to Equarius Waterworks.

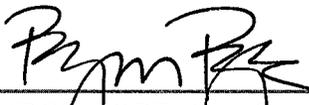
