The notice of this hearing was published as required by law and an affidavit to this effect is on file with the City Clerk.

The records and files of the Police Department and the report of the Chief of Police concerning this matter are made a part of the record of this hearing.

Police Lieutenant/Traffic Bureau Commander Mark Rosen explained the program to offer a service to the community that will allow police officers to inspect vehicles that have been cited for correctable traffic violations and certify that the corrections have been made.

There were no members of the audience who wished to comment. Mayor Krasne closed the public hearing.

James Latta, Human Services Administrator, explained the program which would be a one-time opportunity for carefully screened individuals who meet the criteria and

have demonstrated commitment to a 90-day program through a recognized provider. He mentioned Beverly Hills will be the first city in Los Angeles County to adopt such a program.

Speaking:

David Daniels, Public Counsel, the Directing Attorney of the Homelessness Law Prevention project, explained the significance of Beverly Hills taking the leadership in adopting this program and how the implementation in Beverly Hills would make a difference for his program.

Comment: Provides for the contract work to renovate the locker rooms and restrooms at the Tennis Center to upgrade the 20 year old facility as part of the fiscal year 09-10 Capital Improvement Program budget. The first and second low bidders failed to provide evidence of at least three completed projects that meet the minimum dollar value specified in the bid documents for Specific Qualifications, and are therefore non-responsive and rejected. The bid submitted by Cornerstone Construction Group, Inc. was fully responsive to the bid requirements.

14. **A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY FOR FUNDING OF THE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF TEN TRAFFIC SIGNALS UPGRADE AND SYNCHRONIZATION ALONG NORTH SANTA MONICA BOULEVARD.**

Comment: Approval of this Memorandum accepts \$1,308,000 for design and upgrade of the existing traffic signal system along North Santa Monica Boulevard in conjunction with a local share of \$561,000. This project is independent of other rehabilitation projects for this boulevard.

Vice Mayor Delshad confirmed that the upgrade of the existing traffic signals in this MOU are in line with the Council's plan with Smart City concepts.

15. **OFFICE LEASE AND MEMORANDUM OF LEASE WITH PARTICIPANT MEDIA, LLC.** Comment: Council approval is requested for a lease between the City of Beverly Hills and Participant Media, LLC to lease approximately 24,331 square feet, for ten years at the 331 Foothill Road building.

City Attorney Wiener noted for the record that Exhibit A and Exhibit F for Participant Media had been missing from the Council's packet, and since provided, and the motion includes these Exhibits.

APPROVAL OF A CHANGE ORDER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$115,746.00 TO THE PURCHASE ORDER TO RINCON CONSULTANTS, INC. FOR A NOT-TO-EXCEED TOTAL OF \$385,368.00. Comment: This amendment is required in

conjunction with a change in the scope of work set forth in the City's existing agreement with the consultant to include an environmental analysis of a museum project alternative.

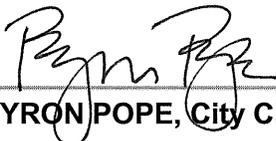
