**1. APPEAL OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION'S DECISION DENYING A REQUEST FOR AMENDMENT OF A DEVELOPMENT PLAN REVIEW PERMIT FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 8767 WILSHIRE BOULEVARD.**

Comment: The applicant has filed an appeal to revise conditions of approval to allow medical uses on the site and eliminate 52 parking spaces that are currently required to be made available to the public. Staff recommends setting this item for public hearing at the Regular City Council Meeting on February 2, 2010 at 7pm. TO CONSIDER:

Mayor Krasne requested that all information from the very first time this project was ever presented to the City be made available to the Council at least a week prior to the February 2, 2010 meeting.

**2. RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE SCHEDULE OF TAXES, FEES & CHARGES TO ADJUST THE PARKING FACILITY RATES AFTER THE FREE**

**PARKING PERIOD FOR FISCAL YEAR 2009/2010.** Comment: At the request of the City Council, staff is returning with rate proposals for off-street parking fees after the 1 and 2 hour free parking periods. Rate proposals will include the hourly rate and time increment after the free parking periods, the after 6pm flat rate, and a pay-as-you-go parking and validation program at the Civic Center and Bedford garages. Staff requests the public hearing be continued to the City Council meeting of January 5, 2010.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS TO MODIFY PREFERENTIAL PERMIT PARKING ZONE "YY" ON THE 1200, 1300 AND 1400 BLOCKS OF PARK WAY.** Comment: Per City Council direction at the October 6 City Council meeting, this item is to reconsider modification of the 8:00 p.m. to 2:30 a.m., daily, Except by Permit YY on the south side of these blocks. The proposed modification would be to change the regulation to 10:00 p.m. to 2:30 a.m., daily, Except by Permit YY.

Deputy Director of Transportation Aaron Kunz provided a PowerPoint presentation and staff report for this item.

**ITEM E-1: ADOPTED RES#09-R-12719**

2. **FISCAL YEAR 2009/10 1ST QUARTER BUDGET STATUS REPORT AND ECONOMIC UPDATE.** Comment: An overview of the City's revenues and expenditures for the first quarter of fiscal year 2009/10 and an overview of projected future economic conditions.

Director of Administrative Services/Chief Financial Officer Scott Miller introduced the new Budget and Revenue Officer Don Harrison who presented the first part of the Fiscal Year 2009/10 Budget Status Report. Mr. Harrison noted staff will continue to monitor very closely and by mid-February will have better assumptions based on preliminary holiday sales and preliminary business tax data.

Dr. Miller provided an economic outlook for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2009/10 and discussed economic considerations that might impact the City's finances.

City Manager Wood provided insight on the remainder of this fiscal year, and recommendations on adjustments to the budget shortfall expectation of \$2-3 million. He then made projections about next year's budget and the things the Council needs to look at during the upcoming budget cycle.

Dr. Miller pointed out other long-term financial and budget issues that Beverly Hills will have to deal with in the next few years.

3. **APPROVAL OF THE ALTERNATIVE RETIREE MEDICAL PROGRAM INCLUDING SHORT TERM FINANCING FOR THE PROGRAM.** Comment: Staff proposes Council implement an alternative retiree medical program (ARMP) that would allow current employees to choose from the alternative retiree medical program or the existing retiree medical benefits program. This program would result in significant costs savings for the City over a 40 year period.

Dr. Scott Miller provided the PowerPoint and presentation. He spoke about a five-program plan to achieve Council's goal. Tonight the Council is looking at Program 4 for an alternative retiree medical program. He talked about a future Program 5 for a two-tier employee retirement program for new employees that was briefly discussed at this afternoon's Study Session.

MOVED by Vice Mayor Delshad, seconded by Mayor Krasne to approve the Alternate Retiree Medical Program including Short Term Financing for the program.
