Subject: RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS APPROVING A FINAL STATEMENT OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OBJECTIVES AND PROJECTED USE OF FUNDS FOR THIRTY-SIXTH YEAR (2010-2011) FUNDING UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1974 AS AMENDED

RECOMMENDATION

Staff respectfully recommends the City Council adopt the attached Resolution approving the City's annual application to the Los Angeles County Community Development Commission (LACDC) for the 2010-2011 Program Year funds under the federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. Staff also recommends that these funds support the City's current programs benefiting low to moderate-income residents.

The purpose of the application is to identify the general categories of eligible activities the grant is to fund. Staff will be returning to the City Council at a later date with recommendations for specific service providers. Adoption of the resolution approving the application does not preclude the City Council from making changes when it considers specific programs or agencies for funding in the future. The 2010-2011 CDBG program year begins July 1, 2010, consistent with the City's fiscal year.

INTRODUCTION

The federal allocations for 2010-2011 have not yet been finalized. However, the City has been informed that its preliminary CDBG funding estimate is \$256,626. Any difference in the final funding figure would be distributed proportionally among the proposed programs. It is proposed that the 2010-2011 CDBG funding continue to support the City's ongoing projects. Up to ten percent (10%) of the annual allocation may be used for CDBG Administration which is projected to be \$25,662 in 2010-2011. Fifteen percent (15%) of the annual allocation may be used for public service programs such as the Services for Seniors

program. The balance of CDBG funds (75%) is to be used to fund the City's Handyworker Program.

The proposed 2010-2011 CDBG budget is summarized in the attached resolution.

DISCUSSION

Below are descriptions of the activities proposed for CDBG funding in 2010-2011.

Services For Seniors Program

Beverly Hills has identified a high level of need for public service programs for seniors and, in the past, has used the federally allowed maximum amount of CDBG funds for such programs. The City's Services for Seniors Program consists of the Senior Case Management program provided by the non-profit Jewish Family Service (JFS). Senior Case Management is a program of careful monitoring and ongoing support for older adults who need assistance from a social worker, coordination of in-home care services, and counseling to continue living independently.

When staff returns to the City Council with recommendations for CDBG program service providers for 2010-2011, it will recommend the 15% public service allocation (\$38,494) continue to support the JFS Senior Case Management program.

Handyworker Programs

The City historically has funded both Multi-Family and Single-Family Handyworker Programs. These programs were provided for several years by the non-profit Veterans In Community Service (VICS). However, after two rounds of Requests for Proposals this year, staff will be recommending a contract with JFS, our Services for Seniors provider, for the Handyworker Programs as well. These programs provide minor home repairs, mobility, and security improvements to low and moderate income Beverly Hills residents. It is recommended that the Multi-Family Program be funded in the amount of \$115,482, and the Single-Family Program be funded in the amount of \$76,988. Up to 50 Multi-Family households and 20 Single-Family households could be served by this program in 2010-2011.

PUBLIC NOTICE AND COMMENTS

The CDBG requirements for citizen participation in the application process were met by publishing announcements in the *Beverly Hills Weekly* on December 31, 2009 and in the *Beverly Hills Courier* on January 1, 2010 and posting a notice in public buildings on December 22, 2009 for the January 12, 2010 City Council meeting.

FISCAL IMPACT

Costs associated with these proposed programs will be reimbursed to the City at the end of the fiscal year using CDBG funds. There will be no fiscal impact to the City's General Fund.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS
APPROVING A FINAL STATEMENT OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT
OBJECTIVES AND PROJECTED USE OF FUNDS FOR THIRTY-SIXTH
YEAR (2010-2011) FUNDING UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY
DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1974 AS AMENDED

The City Council of the City of Beverly Hills does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. That certain Fiscal Year 2010-2011 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program and Budget, a copy of which is on file in the Office of the City Clerk and which consists of the following Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) 2010-2011 Planning Summary, is hereby approved, subject to the right of the City to amend the Community Development Activity Program.

Should the City's final allocation of funds vary from the figure used in the 2010-2011 Planning Summary, the City Manager is authorized to distribute the final allocation proportionally among the approved projects.

Section 2. The Mayor and/or City Manager is authorized to execute the agreements necessary to implement the Community Development Block Grant Projects outlined herein.

Section 3. The City Manager is authorized to direct staff to submit the City's final application package for Fiscal Year 2010-2011 to the County of Los Angeles reflecting the funding allocations set forth herein. Should the City's allocation vary by 25% from the figures contained herein, the City Manager has discretion to authorize the allocation of such additional funding to any eligible activities.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall furnish a copy of the approved Fiscal Year 2010-2011 CDBG Program and Budget and a copy of this resolution to: Community Development Block Grant Division, Community Development Commission, County of Los Angeles, 2 Coral Circle, Monterey Park, California 91755.


