RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council adopt "Resolution of the Council of the City of Beverly Hills Authorizing Submission of a Regional Used Oil Payment Program Online Application on Behalf of the Cities of Beverly Hills, West Hollywood and Culver City to Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) for Fiscal Year 2010-2011".

INTRODUCTION

The Westside Cities, comprised of Beverly Hills, West Hollywood and Culver City, participate in a regional Used Oil Recycling Block Program funded by CalRecycle. The City of Beverly Hills will serve as lead agency for this program effective July 1, 2010.

DISCUSSION

CalRecycle is a new department within the California Natural Resources Agency and administers programs formerly managed by the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) and Division of Recycling.


Back in 2008, staff requested and received authorization for submission of the regional Used Oil Recycling Block Program funded by CIWMB for fiscal years 2008-2011 (Resolutions 08-R-12610). However, since CIWMB transitioned into CalRecycle at the beginning of 2010, staff is requesting authorization under the new agency name.

For the last fourteen years, the Cities of Beverly Hills, West Hollywood and Culver City have participated in a regional Used Oil Recycling Block Program. The funds are used to promote oil recycling, and in part, to hire KJ Services as a consultant who is responsible for promoting the program through public outreach and education, provide giveaway items, attend City sponsored events, and prepare reports. KJ Services has worked with the Westside Cities for ten years.

The City of Beverly Hills last served as lead agency for this program in fiscal year 2002-2003, and 2008 to the present. The City of Culver City will serve as lead agency after fiscal year 2010-2011 for the Westside Cities.

FISCAL IMPACT

The funding for the Used Oil Payment Program will not exceed the payment from CalRecycle.

RESOLUTION NO. 10-R-

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF A REGIONAL USED OIL PAYMENT PROGRAM ONLINE APPLICATION ON BEHALF OF THE CITIES OF BEVERLY HILLS, WEST HOLLYWOOD AND CULVER CITY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF RESOURCES RECYCLING AND RECOVERY (CALRECYCLE) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2010-2011

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Public Resources Code §48690, the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (“CalRecycle”) formerly known as the California Integrated Waste Management Board, has established the Used Oil Payment Program (“OPP”) to make payments to qualifying jurisdictions for implementation of their used oil programs; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of this authority, CalRecycle is required to establish procedures governing the administration of the OPP; and

WHEREAS, CalRecycle’s procedures for administering the OPP require, among other things, a regional applicant’s governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of the OPP;

The City Council of the City of Beverly Hills does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. The City of Beverly Hills (“City”) is authorized to submit an OPP regional application on behalf of itself as Lead Agency and the participating agencies/jurisdictions: City, Cities of West Hollywood and Culver City.

Section 2. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute in the name of City all documents, including but not limited to, applications, agreements, annual reports

including expenditure reports and amendments necessary to secure said payments to support the
OPP.

Section 3. This authorization is effective until rescinded by the City Council.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution and shall
cause this Resolution and his certification to be entered in the Book of Resolutions of the
Council of this City.


