**3. Proposal for In-Lieu Payment**

Hillstone Restaurant Group, Inc., owners of the South Beverly Grill, 122 S. Beverly Drive, proposed to make an in-lieu payment to meet their Public Art Ordinance obligation, thereby allowing them, if they so choose, to remove the existing piece of Bernar Venet sculpture. The Hillstone Group's original Public Art obligation associated with this project was \$21,000 and that is the amount of money they would like to pay to satisfy their obligation.

#### 5. **Proposal for Loaned Exhibit**

Staff will provide an update on the proposal by the Paul Kasmin Gallery for an exhibition of outdoor sculptures by the French artists known as Les Lalanne. The Gallery agrees to provide insurance at current market value, and accepts the practice of the City not to provide any more than the regular police patrols guarding City property as being sufficient. They are looking for autumn of 2012 for the loaned installation of the artwork.

Chair Friedman reported on her efforts to reach The Big Rig project promoters. She spoke to Tom Arnold, of the Mary Boone Gallery. As of 3 weeks ago, Beverly Hills Fine Art Commission was the only representative of any West Coast city to make contact with them regarding the project. It is now up to Chair Friedman to write a letter to Mr. Fischl stating the reasons she believes Beverly Hills should be one of the stops of this unique art exhibit.

Commissioner Pressman, when discussing the Maintenance/Preservation efforts, had thought that once we identified the conservators who were interested in bidding on the Citywide contract, she had been under the impression that letters to these individuals had gone out requesting their bids. That is not the case. The scope of work has yet to be determined, so that when the bids come in, whoever is making the decision, can compare apples to apples and oranges to oranges.

Vice Chair Smooke brought an article from the paper marketing the fact that the Hammer has developed the free App to interface with their art collection.

Community Services Steve Zoet gave an update on the following Capital Improvement Projects (CIP):

- Greystone Mansion HVAC System  
Installation of the mansion’s HVAC is continuing on schedule. Weekly meetings at Greystone are continuing with plans for the November Home Showcase event and a Ball of Artists event scheduled for January 2012.
- Gateway Signage Project  
Staff expects the Wilshire/Whittier Gateway project to start construction by September. The Santa Monica Blvd/Doheny Drive privately held property needed to accommodate gateway features for that location, is being pursued for acquisition.
- Roxbury Community Center  
Staff met with the City Council Liaisons and provided information about known costs of the current facility and projected costs of the proposed new facility. The current architect’s plans are with the Community Development Department for review. There is no specific date as to when this may be brought to City Council for further review and action.

TAB 5. Director’s Report

Director of Community Services Steve Zoet and Staff provided the Commission with updates on the following:

- July is Parks & Recreation Month – Flyer was presented
- LA Lawyer’s Philharmonic have proposed to staff to provide two concerts in exchange for use of practice space at Roxbury Park. Request needs Council approval.
- Adult School – The School District greatly curtailed Adult School offerings so the City will be providing some of the Adult classes they have discontinued.

- Beverly Hills Active Adult Cookbook Fundraiser – A request was made for recipes for inclusion in their cookbook.
- Errant Foul Balls – A non-resident living on outskirts of La Cienega Park has been receiving “errant foul balls” from the La Cienega Baseball Field. \$30,000 in additional funds have been spent to make amenities to the fence, but it still has not completely alleviated the issue. Staff continues to examine additional ways to remedy the issue.
- Summer Concert Series – The “Concerts on Canon” will be conducted on Thursday evenings from July 21 – August 25, 2011. Two concert sets at 6 p.m. and 7:15 p.m. will be held featuring various music genres.
- Catering Kitchen Update – The references have been called for the three finalists in the Catering Kitchen. It is projected they will not be completely approved and involved until January 2012.
- Gran Fondo – This was a coordinated effort with Rodeo Drive Committee and BH Conference & Visitors Bureau for an event to celebrate Italian culture and lifestyle. The bike ride was held with 1300 participants starting at Rodeo Drive and ending at the 9900 Wilshire Blvd. building. There was very little impact to the community as it was held early on a Sunday Morning.
- Angelo Drive Update  
Parks & Urban Forest Manger Ken Pfalzgraf reported that on May 24, 2011, the City Council had approved the removal and replacement of trees from the south parkway of the 1700 block of Angelo Drive. After explaining the extensive process (including meetings and balloting of the street) several people have now come forward in opposition and have put a pause on the process. The City will now be re-surveying the street to re-confirm the results.

Speaker – Angelo Drive resident Leslie Schlecter presented photos to the Commissioners and gave insight into the matter currently on Angelo Drive in regard to the Ficus tree roots that have been damaging hers and her neighbor’s sewer lines.

There also ensued a discussion regarding the potential location sites for the installation of this iconic piece.

**5. Recommendation to provide increased landscaping around Kusama's *Hymn of Life***

Staff recommended, rather than installing a 3-level cable fence around the *Hymn of Life* to keep people from climbing on it, that there be a wider planter area with a more formidable plant, and a higher cement curb, as well as signage with a stronger presence to deter the public from interacting with it inappropriately.

Staff has booked Rochelle Branch to speak at the September Fine Art Commission meeting. Ms. Branch works for the City of Pasadena and has been a participant in the development of their Fine Art Master Plan.

**7. Draft letter requesting maintenance and restoration services for public art pieces.**

A request for proposal is being crafted to send out to prospective conservators. We are also formalizing our approach to the developer owned works of art accepted to fulfill the Fine Art obligation, and which are the responsibility of the property owners, not the City. Due to the City's interest in these pieces being maintained properly, we will also codify an approach to guarantee these pieces are being checked regularly for condition.

Chair Friedman led a discussion on the maintenance of the Dan Graham, and what repair issues could come up over the long term.

Chair Friedman reported on a meeting between herself, Vice Chair Smooke and Staff Liaison with the Human Relations Commission. What came out of the meeting was the fact that people on the Commission did not understand how art is purchased for the City. Chair Friedman stressed that The Fine Art Commission needs to find new ways to educate the residents and Commissioners with regard to that process.

Vice Chair Smooke raised the issue of the Joel Shapiro piece; Staff stated that the location of the Shapiro piece is an issue that will be on the agenda for the Council Liaison meeting.

Vice Chair Smooke also recounted her trip to Basal, in Switzerland, where the artists most prominently featured there are all prominently featured in the Beverly Hills Public Art Collection; our collection was very well represented.
