INTRODUCTION

The City has been approved for funding under the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant program.

BACKGROUND

Under the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) program, the United States Department of Homeland Security provides grant funding to local jurisdictions for the unique planning, equipment, training and exercise needs of high-threat, high-density urban areas. It assists them in building sustainable capacity to prevent, protect, respond, and recover from acts of terrorism. The UASI grant program for the Los Angeles/Long Beach area is administered by the City of Los Angeles.

DISCUSSION

The Fire Department will use UASI 10 funding to complete phase 2-of-3 of the Smart Classroom project. The UASI 11 funding will be used for the Fire Department Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear & Explosive (CBRNE) training, Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) response team training, Disaster Awareness Course (DAC), Regional Terrorism Liaison Officer (TLO) training and to complete phase 3-of-3 of the Smart Classroom project for the region.

The Police Department has also been awarded funding under the FY2011 UASI grant program. This \$64,630 in funds will be used to purchase three (3) mobile ALPR systems and install them in police vehicles. This equipment will assist law enforcement in recovering stolen vehicles, apprehending wanted persons, locating missing persons, etc. Data collected by the equipment will also be shared with allied agencies and assist the region in apprehending criminals and identifying other homeland security threats.

FISCAL IMPACT


The cost for completion of the Smart Classroom project, the various trainings, and the purchase for mobile ALPR systems is estimated to total \$1,652,928.00. The City will be reimbursed by the City of Los Angeles for authorized grant expenditures. The purchases related to the Fire and Police Departments will not have an impact on the Internal Service Fund budget in FY12/13 or future years. Additionally, as none of the equipment will be placed on the Fund 40 Equipment Replacement schedule or the Information Technology Replacement schedule, these purchases will not lead to increases in the Fire and Police Departments' budgets in future years.
