**ITEM D-1: BY ORDER OF THE CHAIR, WITH NO OBJECTIONS, HEARING IS CONTINUED TO SEPTEMBER 11, 2012**

This being the time and place set, a public hearing was held to consider:

2. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS APPROVING THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO A DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AND 9200 WILSHIRE, LLC FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A MIXED-USE RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT AT 9200 WILSHIRE BOULEVARD. First Reading - For Introduction. Comment: The proposed amendment would allow for the expiration date of the existing development agreement to be aligned with expiration of the project's existing vesting tentative map, and would also allow for up to three, one-year extensions beyond the expiration date of the vesting tentative map. The development agreement is currently set to expire on October 18, 2012 if the amendment is not approved.

The notice of the hearing was published as required by law and an affidavit to this effect is on file with the City Clerk.

The records and files of the Community Development Department and the report of the Director of Community Development concerning this matter shall be entered into the record.

Director of Community Development Susan Healy Keene provided a brief PowerPoint presentation on the project. She noted that the mixed-use project was approved by City Council in 2007. She discussed the development agreement, the timelines, the development agreement amendment, and staff recommendation.

Vice Mayor Mirisch asked clarification questions regarding the development agreement and vesting map expiration dates, and mutual agreement by both City and applicant. He expressed concerns regarding the unpredictability of extensions. City Attorney Wiener explained the extension process for development agreement and vesting map, and obtaining tentative and final tract maps. Lee Silver and Arnold Rosenstein, applicants, provided the reasons for extending the project. Mayor Brien gave a historical background on how the project discussions started. City Manager Kolin explained that two models (9900 Wilshire and Hilton) were used as reference for this project.

Councilmember Gold commented that the benefits to the City are clear and he is fine with the moving forward with the project. Councilmember Brucker noted that the EMS fees continue in perpetuity notwithstanding the extensions which is very helpful to the community. Vice Mayor Mirisch commented that he is in favor of the project in general except the extensions. Mayor Brien indicated that he is in favor of the project and acknowledged the work done by everyone involved.

1. ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING THE BEVERLY HILLS MUNICIPAL CODE TO AMEND THE NUMBER OF NONRESIDENT MEMBERS OF THE HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION. First Reading - For Introduction. Comment: Amends the Municipal Code regarding the Human Relations Commission to allow for one nonresident member, rather than two nonresident members, to be consistent with the previous change from seven members to five.

Human Services Administrator James Latta delivered a brief staff report noting that on January 24, 2012, City Council approved the ordinance reducing the Human Relations

Commission membership from seven to five. He explained the amendment being proposed.

2. ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING THE BEVERLY HILLS MUNICIPAL CODE TO INCREASE THE RADIUS REQUIREMENTS FOR LOCATION OF BUSINESS OFFICE OF VEHICLE TOWING SERVICES. First Reading - For introduction. Comment: This ordinance amends the Municipal Code to increase the radius requirement for towing service companies from 5 to 7 miles

Sgt. Michael Foxen provided a brief staff report noting that only one company, Quicksilver Towing, submitted a proposal the last time the Police Department did an RFP. He explained that increasing the radius from five to seven miles will increase the number of companies that will submit proposals thereby promoting a better bidding process.

Councilmember Gold requested an update from City Manager Kolin regarding the status of payment of fees owed by the current provider to the City. He suggested that the present and past performance be made a criterion when making the decision in selecting the provider during the RFP process.

Councilmember Brucker asked whether it will be to the City's advantage to have two authorized tow companies under contract with the City. City Attorney Wiener explained that the Police Chief has the discretion to extend the 7-mile radius coverage if necessary. Councilmember Brucker asked whether the City has the ability to structure out an RFP to choose a primary provider and a backup.

MOVED by Councilmember Gold, seconded by Councilmember Brucker to introduce and read by title only and advance to the meeting of September 11, 2012 for adoption Ordinance E-2 as follows:

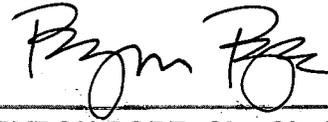
