### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the resolution accepting a donation of \$60,000 from Cedars-Sinai Medical Center and move to approve an appropriation as follows:

### INTRODUCTION

Cedars-Sinai Medical Center has presented a donation in the amount of \$60,000 to the City. The organization requested that the funds be used by the Police Department to enhance the safety of the community.

**DISCUSSION**

The Police Department's vision is to become the model organization of the law enforcement profession. This vision is being accomplished through an uncompromising dedication to public service and continuous improvement in hiring and law enforcement techniques. To fulfill this vision, the Beverly Hills Police Department employs the highest caliber personnel in the profession, furnishes them with the highest quality cutting edge equipment possible, and trains them in the most current and pertinent law enforcement techniques available.

Cedars-Sinai Medical Center has specifically requested that its donation be used to purchase chemical, biological, radiation, and nuclear (CBRN) detection equipment and to support the Police Department's Explorer Program.

The CBRN detection equipment will be installed at key locations within the City or on police patrol vehicles and will improve the City's ability to safeguard the community from terrorist acts. The purchase of this equipment is in conformance with the City's Homeland Security and Disaster Strategic Plan.


The Explorer Program trains and prepares high school students for future careers in law enforcement. Students are mentored by veteran Police Department personnel and exposed to various facets of the department's operations. The donated funds will be used to assist with this training.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

An appropriation of \$60,000 is requested to fund purchases for the Emergency Services Bureau and the Police Community Relations Unit. The City has received a donation of \$60,000 from Cedars-Sinai Medical Center to offset these expenditures.

The immediate impact of the purchase of CBRN detection equipment on the Police Department's equipment replacement budget is unknown. Once the recommended equipment is identified, this impact and will be determined by the cost of the items and their anticipated number of years of useful operation. As part of the evaluation process to purchase this equipment, staff will consult with the Office of Management and Budget on how the recommended purchases will impact Internal Service Fund charges.

ACCEPTING A DONATION OF \$60,000 FROM CEDARS-SINAI  
MEDICAL CENTER TO ENHANCE COMMUNITY SAFETY

The Council of the City of Beverly Hills does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. The City has received a donation from Cedars-Sinai Medical Center to be used by the City's Police Department to enhance the safety of the community.

Section 2. The donated funds in the amount of \$60,000 will be deposited to the City's General Fund.

Section 3. Appropriation of funds in the amount of \$60,000 is authorized as follows:
