## Rules for Dog Park as Recommended by the Recreation and Parks Commission

- Animals other than dogs are prohibited
- Dogs must display a current license tag
- Food or treats, human or canine, is prohibited
- No aggressive dogs are allowed
- Owners are fully responsible for their dog(s) at all times
- If a dog bites a person or other animal, the offending animal's owner is to exchange information with all parties involved
- Owners must pick up after their dogs
- Dogs that cry or yelp for more than five minutes may be required to leave
- Dogs under 4 months of age are prohibited
- Dogs that have not been spayed or neutered are prohibited unless documentation can be provided indicating that they are exempt
- Dogs in heat are prohibited
- Abandoning animals is prohibited
- No more than three (3) dogs per person
- Park capacity is 40 dogs (20 in each of the large and small dog areas)
- Grooming, dog training and related professional services is not allowed
- No adults are allowed unless accompanied by a dog or dog owner
- Children under the age of 14 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult at all times
- Loitering in the restrooms is prohibited
- Smoking, vaping and use of all tobacco products is prohibited
- Consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited
- Camping and/or the storage of personal property is prohibited
- Climbing of trees and other natural or man-made structures is prohibited
- Conducting or participating in any activity that creates a hazard or danger to others or property is prohibited
- Operating, riding or propelling a wheeled device in the park is prohibited
- Conducting or participating in any group course or instruction is prohibited
- Operating sound amplifying equipment is prohibited
- Defacing, damaging or removing any City equipment or site furnishings is prohibited
- Selling any goods, wares merchandise, foodstuffs, refreshments or other kinds of property or services is prohibited

Upon the adoption of or modification to any of the above referenced rules, staff will work with the City Attorney to assure they are in appropriate form and context and are enforceable before finalization.
