Mayor Delshad presented Judith A. Friedman with a Certificate of Appointment to the Fine Art Commission. Terri Smooke was not in attendance.

Captain Robert Curtis introduced Jay Kim who was recently promoted to this position. Captain Curtis mentioned Acting Sergeant Kim came to Beverly Hills from LAPD.

Mr. Kim discussed his role as Acting Sergeant and acknowledged his coworkers on the force for being the best of the best to provide quality service to the community, and mentioned how happy he is to serve the City of Beverly Hills.

CITY COUNCIL REVIEW OF THE ARCHITECTURAL COMMISSION'S DECISION DENYING THE PRELIMINARY PLANS FOR A PROPOSED OFFICE BUILDING AT 8767 WILSHIRE BOULEVARD. *Comment:* At its meeting of July 11, 2007, the Architectural Commission denied the preliminary plans for the proposed office building at 8767 Wilshire Boulevard. The City Council ordered review of the Architectural Commission's decision on July 24, 2007. **(TAKEN OUT OF ORDER)**

The notice of this hearing was published as required by law and an affidavit to this effect is on file with the City Clerk.

The report of the Director of Community Development and the record of the Community Development department in this matter are made a part of the record of this hearing.

Community Development Director Vince Bertoni presented the staff report. Mr. Bertoni outlined the reasons for the Architectural Commission's decision for denial.

Senior Planner Rita Naziri summarized the specific objections of the Architectural Commission.

Commissioner Walter Meyer elaborated on the reasons the Commission voted 6 to 1 against the development and design of this project.

Speaking:

Joe Tilem, attorney representing the applicant, identified the changes requested by the Commissioners and the changes that were made. Mr. Tilem requested preliminary approval of the project so they can move forward and work out the details with the Architectural Commission.

There were no other members of the audience who wished to comment. Mayor Delshad closed the public hearing.

The Council asked questions for clarification from the Commissioners and directed that the Commission reach consensus for the developer to follow.

There were no further questions or comments of Councilmembers.

MOVED by Councilmember Briskman, seconded by Councilmember Krasne that the project get preliminary approval to be able to proceed and once the Ad Hoc Committee of the Architectural Commission has met to reach consensus with the applicant, then the facade rendering should return to the City Council for approval.

2. **PRESENTATION OF PARK MASTER PLAN. Comment: Presentation of Park Master Plan for La Cienega Park and Roxbury Memorial Park. (TAKEN OUT OF ORDER)**

Director of Community Services Steve Miller provided introductory remarks and gave a background of the 14 month public outreach process. Mr. Miller noted the Council (and community) direction was to make Roxbury and La Cienega parks the best they can be, and then determine if there is still a deficit/void in recreational facilities that need to be addressed. Mr. Miller outlined the format for the presentation this evening.

Deputy Director Pat Agnitch presented the community outreach efforts for the Parks Master Plan. Ms. Agnitch spoke about programming and facility deficiencies at Roxbury and La Cienega Parks.

Pat Hirsch, from the consulting firm Hirsch and Associates, and sub consultant Steve Albert presented the details of the Master Plans for both parks.

Director Miller noted the current 18,000 square feet of meeting space in both parks versus 27,000 square feet of meeting space in the proposed Master Plans making a net gain of approximately 9,000 square feet.

Dr. Scott Miller, Chief Financial Officer, reported on the various ways the Council can fund this project through a combination of grant dollars, fund dollars, etc.

Commissioners Roberts, O'Krent and Chair Blumenfeld spoke about the Master Plan process and requested the Council support the Commission in moving forward with Plan B-3 for Roxbury Park.

Director of Community Services Steve Miller provided more details of the park specifics and noted the staff would come back for further direction in the coming months.

Speaking:

1. Lance Roth, Regional Commissioner for Beverly Hills AYSO, spoke about the condition of both parks (fields, restrooms and facilities) and the need for renovation.

2. Matt Robb stated he is satisfied with the parks in their current condition and suggested an alternative plan for the proposed funding.

3. Howard Goldstein spoke about the insufficiencies of the parks, and suggested if there is a delay in reaching a decision because of Roxbury Park to separate them and to move forward with La Cienega Park.

4. Charles Brucker commented on the high costs to maintain the bowling green space which is also used by residents of the City of Los Angeles and

suggested the City of Los Angeles be asked to share in the cost of the remodel.

5. Ken Goldman, President of the Southwest Homeowners, spoke in opposition to the components of Plan B-3 and recommended an alternate plan that would preserve the qualities of play and rest area of this neighborhood park in a residential area and he asked that the City maintain the park once it is renovated.

6. Lori Goldman commented on the role Roxbury Park plays in all of their lives and maintenance issues regarding the play area and equipment.

7. Steve Webb thanked the Recreation & Parks Commission and staff for their dedication and volunteer hours in this effort, and urged the City Council not to put everything into the two existing parks, but look for a third location in the City to accommodate the needs of the community.

8. Adrienne Weitzman provided her opinion regarding the limitation on the remodel of Roxbury Park.

9. Marcia Hollander quoted the Mayor from an article in the *Beverly Hills Courier* regarding the City's budget and requested a maintenance program for Roxbury Park.

10. Gloria Seiff listed what the neighbors do and do not want to see at Roxbury Park.

11. Caryl Marks spoke about the condition of the Community Center at Roxbury Park and urged the Council to keep it simple.

12. Kathleen Rothner thanked the Commission for their hours of work and urged the Council to move forward with a plan tonight.

13. Ellen Horwitz spoke in support of the Master Plan B-3 concept for Roxbury Park and urged the Council to support it.

14. Debbie Grossman commented on the proposed parking structures and mentioned the history and character of Roxbury Park.

15. Allan Grossman, representative of the Beverly Hills Lawn Bowling Club, spoke about the plan to move the lawn bowling site to a new location and asked that it remain as is.

16. Joni Gitlin expressed her opposition to the proposed plan for Roxbury Park and suggested the funds be spent to repair and maintain the parks.

17. Mildred Heller, President of the Senior Adult Club at Roxbury Park, spoke about the needs of the community and continuing the Senior Club with the upcoming baby boomers.

18. Michael Hariri mentioned the needs of the youth in the community and offered suggestions on what could be provided in the Master Plan for the parks.

19. Margie Blatt submitted a letter from Jerry Joltan opposing the project and she raised questions about the plans and the costs presented and suggested how the plan could be improved.

20. Bruce Horowitz, speaking on behalf of the Beverly Hills Basketball League, spoke in support of the Park Master Plan.

21. Peggy Kaus spoke in opposition of the Park Master Plan for Roxbury Park and suggested only doing needed maintenance for the park.

The Council recessed at 9:56 p.m. and reconvened at 10:05 p.m. with all Councilmembers present.

22. Bianca Kahlili spoke about the need to consider teens in the Park Master Plan and the value of creating activities and a place for them to be able to participate.

23. Rose Norton asked specific questions about the plan and noted it was difficult for her to read and urged the Council not to pursue underground parking.

24. Fern Seizer asked the Council to restore and maintain Roxbury Park and save costs in not rebuilding it.

25. Mary Levin Cutler spoke about the cost of the Park Master Plan and suggested only attending to what needs to be repaired and maintained.

26. David Gordon spoke about maintenance problems with Roxbury Park and expressed opposition to the underground parking structure.

27. Esther Tabak commented on the seniors needs at Roxbury Park and asked for a Par 4 course around the walking space.

28. Esther Brenner, speaking on behalf of the Beverly Angeles Homeowners Association, stated they are in agreement with the Southwest Homeowners Association position expressed this evening and urged the Council to listen to the community before making a decision.

29. Xandra Kayden, President of the Croquet Club, asked the Council to consider the passion that is being expressed this evening. Ms. Kayden commented on the benefit of outdoor activity such as croquet.

30. Joe Siegman, President of Beverly Hills Lawn Bowling Club, spoke about the need to keep lawn bowling and croquet available for the seniors.

31. David Gottlieb spoke about the cost and scope of the Roxbury Park

Master Plan.

32. Steven Dahlerbruch suggested having funding in place before proceeding with the project.
33. Victoria Hooks, President of Beverly Hills Little League, spoke about the need for field space for softball and baseball for the youth, and asked the Council to support the Commission's recommendation.
34. Camille Hooks mentioned her involvement with sports at the parks and expressed support for the renovations.
35. Gary Klein supported the Southwest Homeowners Association's position and expressed opposition to the Park Master Plan.
36. Ruth Kraft stated she objects to the amount of money being proposed for the Park Master Plan.
37. Joshua Metzger stated he supports the plan, and noted changes need to take place at both parks.
38. AJ Wilmer commented on the need for change at both parks and urged the Council to support the Commission in their recommendation.
39. Judy Okun spoke about the condition of the restrooms, and compared the quality of programs at La Cienega Park vs. Roxbury Park.
40. Bill Wolff spoke about the draining issue in the Roxbury Park Master Plan, and stated the positioning of the items should be based on the parks needs not the parking needs.

The Council asked questions of staff and the Commissioners and following discussion, it was the consensus of the Council to direct staff to determine the areas of common agreement, obtain information from the School District and put together a report with the pros and cons of each of the individual components; what options might exist for those and some suggestions regarding the priorities in the parks and have the Recreation and Parks Commission review and provide input on this before returning to the Council for consideration. City Manager Wood mentioned staff could also bring forward a demand analysis study on parking.

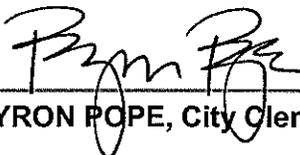
