I believe the Traffic Engineer has spoken with Mrs. Rouse regarding the petition process for speed humps. Unfortunately, other than installing speed humps, which has been attempted before and not enough

support was received to submit a qualifying petition, we do not have additional speed reduction strategies to supplement the 25 mph signs and street/pavement markings. Subject: Excessive auto speed in BH

To Whom It May Concern,

My family owns a 5 unit apartment building located at the NWC of S. Crescent Dr. and Olympic Blvd. The numerical address of the building is 363 S. Crescent Drive; 1 of the units fronts on Olympic Blvd. with a street address of 9361 W. Olympic Blvd. The property APN is 4331-006-017.

The traffic and constant excessive speed coming off Olympic Blvd. from both eastbound and westbound traffic subsequently heading north as well as the traffic speed of autos on S. Crescent Dr. heading in a southerly direction continues to be a serious danger. Having partners that are family members residing in the building as well as a one year old grandson my family is particularly sensitive to this situation.

Might there be a strong effort on the part of the BH DOT and/or BHPD to attempt to curb these danger with flashing speed signs erected as well as the occasional presence of BHPD patrol cars parked in the first alley just north of Olympic? Speed bumps would also help, however, we have never been able to get ALL of the residents to sign on to a request to be provided to the city.

I trust you share our concern and sense of urgency and will consider some form of corrective implementation before someone get serious hurt. I'm sure if the auto accident occurrences alone were checked (during the last 5 years) the file would support our concerns.

I just returned from a meeting at our property having parked on S. Crescent, just north of Olympic, crossing the street was a scary proposition. After waiting 10 minutes watching cars pass by at speed seemingly in excess of 50 mph I was able to cross the street. Earlier in the day one of our employees had her side view mirror knocked off her car with no note left. This same thing has happened at least a dozen times in the last 12 months best we can tell, maybe more.
