SUBJECT: Staff Status Report

The purpose of this staff report is to provide the Commission with updates on pending items; therefore, the Commission cannot make formal recommendations on these items.

a. Valet Operations

As a follow-up to the previous meeting, staff enhanced the original valet inventory map to include customer loading zone locations within the business triangle and on South Beverly Drive. A more detailed inventory of valet operations on the 300 block of North Camden Drive is also attached, followed by the original report (Attachment A).

b. Bicycle Sharing

Fehr & Peers is scheduled to complete the feasibility study in July. Staff is preparing an agreement with *CycleHop Inc.* for City Council.

c. Olympic/Beverly/Beverwil Intersection

Fehr & Peers has completed their initial analysis of options to improve the operations of the intersection. Staff is reviewing this analysis and will forward to the City Council at a future meeting.





This report details the current commercial valet operations within the Beverly Hills business triangle and along South Beverly Drive. Per request by the Traffic & Parking Commission, staff has created an inventory and review of the existing valet services throughout the City.

Background

The City of Beverly Hills regulates, through the issuance of permits, the operation of valet parking services which operate within the public right-of-way. Due to the shortage of on-street parking in the City's business triangle and South Beverly Drive, various businesses apply for these permits to hire valet companies as a parking convenience service for their patrons. Public Works Customer Service staff consult with Traffic Control Officers, the Police Department, Fire Department and Traffic Engineer before approving valet permit requests based on factors such as demand, environmental and traffic impact, safety, facility space and payment of fees. As of May 2015, 48 long-term commercial valets are in operation throughout the City with a total of 93 on-street parking spaces assigned to valet for varying hours, depending on the location (Attachment B). The City also issues short-term valet permits, usually for one-day durations, with an average of 10 total operations at any time citywide.

Long-Term Valet Operations - Business Triangle and South Beverly Drive

Restriction	Assigned on-street parking spaces
Daytime only	4
Evening only	34
Daytime + evening	55

Eight of the current 48 valet operations are conducted in private lots or alleys with no assigned on-street parking spaces. Ten of the locations are shared valet operations funded and used by more than one business. An example is the shared valet between Il Pastiao, Enoteca Drago, Porta Via and La Scala who share a daytime valet on Brighton and evening valet on Canon. The valet operation for businesses located on the same block were grouped together to minimize the impact on parking meter availability. The difference in locations is due to varying demand and traffic safety.

Conclusion

This report is provided to the Traffic & Parking Commission for informational purposes and discussion. If the Traffic & Parking Commission wishes to pursue changes to the City's valet program, staff will evaluate if these changes can be made as part of on-going operations and/or a new work plan program needs to be pursued.
