The Joint City Council Regular and Parking Authority meeting was held in the Council Chambers at 7:00 pm.

B. PRESENTATIONS

1. PROCLAMATION for Barbara Linder

Mayor Mirisch, along with Vice Mayor Bosse, presented a proclamation to Human Relations Commissioner Barbara Linder in honor of her receiving the Champion of the Community Award, the highest honor given annually by the California Parks and Recreation Society. Ms. Linder thanked the Council and the community, introduced her family, and announced that Armstrong Nursery Companies made a commitment to sponsor her demonstration garden at the Greystone Mansion Park in honor of their 125th birthday next year, including providing assistance with the physical set up of the vegetable garden, offering free workshops in the Spring, and actively attracting other corporate sponsors to renovate the area of the park.

This being the time and place set, a public hearing was held to consider:

1. RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS ADOPTING THE GENERAL PLAN 2014-2021 HOUSING ELEMENT UPDATE AND ADOPTING AN ADDENDUM TO A NEGATIVE DECLARATION PURSUANT TO THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT. Comment: Consideration of the adoption of the 2014-2021 General Plan Housing Element Update and associated environmental review document.

The notice of the hearing was published as required by law and an affidavit to this effect is on file with the City Clerk.

The report of the Director of Community Development and the record of the Community Development Department in this matter are made a part of the record of this hearing.

Director of Community Development Susan Healy Keene presented an oral report noting the benefits that will be available to the City with the adoption of the Housing Element Update. She noted the proposed changes to the program from the one originally adopted in 2009.

Speaking:

There were no additional members of the audience who wished to comment. Mayor Mirisch closed the public hearing.

Council expressed concern on the unintended consequences of historic preservation laws. Staff assured Council that even after the adoption of the Housing Element at tonight's meeting, changes can still be made without re-adopting the General Plan.

Furthermore, policies can be added or changed to address code enforcement issues and protect renters' rights. Council has discretion to create local laws and restrictions as long as they are not in conflict with state laws. City Attorney Wiener will look at the existing policies to see if they can be changed or new ones added to deal with repeat landlord violators. Councilmember Brien emphasized the need to differentiate between historic preservation and preservation/renovation. Councilmember Gold suggested to bring the matter to the Cultural Heritage Commission after the City Council has had further discussion.

There were no further questions or comments from Councilmembers.

G. CONTINUED AND NEW BUSINESS

1. CONSULTING SERVICES TO PERFORM A PUBLIC VS. PRIVATE COMPENSATION STUDY. Comment: Council consideration of proposals received for the public vs. private compensation study, all of which came in at a higher cost than allotted by Council. If Council wishes to proceed at higher cost, the City Treasurer recommends Mercer as the vendor.

City Treasurer Eliot Finkel presented a PowerPoint and oral report on this item. He spoke about the purpose of the Committee, named and thanked the committee members, and discussed the employee compensation study and the financial impact of 2-hour free parking.

Councilmembers Krasne, Gold and Brien asked about the design, end goal and time frame of the study, Mercer's credentials and clients, and expressed concern regarding a fair comparison of positions between the public and private sectors considering not just salary, workload and benefits but the skills levels and other benefits such as company profits being passed on to employees as well. Councilmember Brien asked whether there are public documents available on previous studies done by Mercer that can be

reviewed by the City prior to starting the study. He also expressed concern that Mercer helped design and develop the RFP. Vice Mayor Bosse commented that the data gathered from the study will help clear up any false assumptions, and also assist in better future fiscal planning.

MOVED by Vice Mayor Bosse, seconded by Councilmember Krasne, to approve funds in the amount of \$100,000 for the private vs. public compensation study

FY 2012/13 YEAR-END REPORT AND CONSIDERATION OF ALLOCATING AVAILABLE GENERAL FUND BALANCE, INCLUDING APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$14,212,394 AND APPROPRIATION OF \$650,000 OF AVAILABLE FY 2013/14 GENERAL FUND REVENUES FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A THIRD STAFFED PARAMEDIC RESCUE AMBULANCE. Comment: It is recommended that the City Council consider the appropriation of year-end surplus of revenues over expenditures.

Administrative Services Director/Chief Financial Officer Don Rhoads presented a PowerPoint and oral report. He spoke about the financial results for Fiscal Year 2012-2013, the 6-30-13 General Fund balance, available General Fund balance, recommendations and staffing for a third paramedic ambulance.

MOVED by Councilmember Brien, seconded by Councilmember Gold, to approve funds in the amount of \$14,212,394 be appropriated as agreed upon by Council, which includes the \$500,000 from the 336 Foothill building demolition going into the unallocated monies

Comment: This is a request by Councilmember Krasne for the City Council to review the Planning Commission's denial of medical offices, a luxury vehicle showroom, a pharmacy, and expanded restaurant uses within the commercial building located at 8767 Wilshire Boulevard.

REQUEST BY MAYOR MIRISCH FOR CITY COUNCIL REVIEW OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION'S DECISION APPROVING A MINOR ACCOMMODATION AND SECOND UNIT USE PERMIT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A TWO-STORY ACCESSORY STRUCTURE ON THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 700 NORTH LINDEN DRIVE. Comment: On December 12, 2013 the Planning Commission approved a Minor Accommodation and Second Unit Use Permit to allow the construction of a two-story accessory structure at 700 North Linden Drive. The Mayor has asked that the Council discuss the Commission's decision to determine whether there is Council support to call the decision up for review at a de novo public hearing.

Vice Mayor Bosse recused from this item and left the Chambers at 10:03pm.

Senior Planner Ryan Gohlich presented a PowerPoint and oral staff report. He showed site plans and views of the elevation from each direction, and spoke about the Planning Commission review and decision.

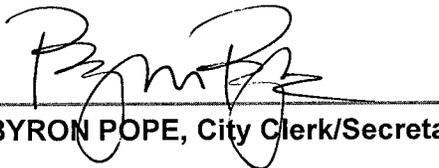
