2. **Request by Mayor Gold to Discuss Bus Shelters with Advertising**

Council does not support bus shelters with ads, but agreed to proceed with concepts for improved bus stop meetings. At a future meeting, staff will provide options of different components including operational costs. Staff will also address the existing three bus shelters that are currently operating in the City on an expired permit.

This item is a proposal from the Mayor's Committee of Next Generation Leaders for a street experience event during the upcoming holiday season that would feature food trucks and entertainment and be open to the community.

Report on the Police Department's plan to implement recommendations recently made by the consultant during its audit.




The Council thanked Chief Rivetti for his report and leadership, and also thanked his support staff. Chief Rivetti acknowledged the partnership between the Police
